The story of a devastating earthquake

Earthquakes leave very serious negative effects in places where there are old building stocks that have repeatedly been destroyed by historical earthquakes. Especially with industrialization, intense migration from rural areas to cities, rapid population growth and unplanned urbanization, the abundance of earthquake-resistant structures increases the vulnerability to earthquakes. The effects of destruction are also seen in the buildings and areas where cultural heritage works are located. In the great disaster that occurred in Turkiye Kahramanmaras city on February 6, 678 historical monuments registered within the General Directorate of Foundations were seriously damaged.
